

Liquor Legislation Amendment Act 2007

Book Up

- As of 15 November 2007, traders with a liquor licence can no longer book up the purchase of goods by retaining customer's credit or any debit cards. If a trader wants to continue trading in this manner the trader can no longer sell liquor and must surrender their liquor licence.
- Payment for liquor must be made at the time of the purchase and in one of the following ways:
 - cash;
 - by cheque drawn by the person and dated on or before the date of the sale;
 - by credit or debit card, at the time of purchase;
 - by debit to an Authorised Deposit Institute account authorised by the person; or
 - by charging the business account of the person or entity.
